We are nearing the end of a fantastic year. Our organization has much to be proud of. Our home grown Region 1 VP Robert King has been recognized twice by National President Pete Reineker for his efforts in the New England. And State president Rosaire Longe has also been recognized twice for his efforts here in Vermont. With more honors possible for both at the upcoming National Convention in June.

Much of their successes have come as a result of National President Pete's Reaching Out campaign. He asked all the states to contact those they hadn't seen or those that had dropped off their state rosters. Here in Vermont we had over thirty members that had dropped off and hadn't seen in some years. Two we found belonged to other states now. All the others have received several letters and newsletters letting them know we wanted them back. In the meantime an anonymous Senator paid for the national portion of their dues to the National organization.
